Lakeside history

Lords of the Lake

This weekend marks 53 years since motorcycle racing began at Lakeside. In that half century, the track has played host to Australia's greatest riders and seen many fabulous races...

It was the slow death of Queensland's two existing circuit, Lowood and Strathpine, that spawned the concept of Lakeside Raceway as the 1950s drew to a close. Just 8km from Strathpine, a former dairy farm at Dakabin had been purchased by motor sport enthusiast

first lap record for bikes at 71 seconds – just two seconds shy of the car mark. As well as the usual classes for racing machinery, the programme included two events for 'Stock Machines'; the 500cc version won by R.Mantova (Triumph) and the Unlimited by veteran all rounder Tony Edwards on a Matchless 650CSR. On the same machine, Edwards chased home Ahearn in the 6 lap Feature Race, while Ahearn also took out the Junior and Senior races on his Nortons, and Kel Carruthers won the combined 125 and 250 race on Clem Daniel's 125 MV Agusta. There were no sidecar races held due to a lack of entries.

Despite the promising start, the QMSC was in dire

Strathpine. Members of the Queensland Motor Sporting Club (QMSC) began working bees at Lakeside, which drew its name from the adjacent Lake Kurwongbah. Infrastructure from both Strathpine and Lowood found its way to the site as the club members laboured away to map out a challenging 2.4 kilometre circuit which made creative use of the undulating terrain and produced a very fast and following circuit. Work began in early 1959 and continued for two years in fits and starts. Money was tight, but cash was raised from the motor industry and by donations from private individuals, and the track opened with a car race meeting 19th March 1961.

On September 10th, 1961, motorcycles took to the track for the first time as part of a two-week festival which saw racing at Lowood the previous weekend. Top man at both meetings was seasoned international Jack Ahearn, who establish the

financial straits and the club embarked on all sorts of money raising activities to reduce the level of debt. Meanwhile, motorcycles began to establish themselves on a regular basis, with much of the promotion and organisation handled by the Motorcycle Sportsmen club. On May 6, 1962, the Queensland Grand Prix was held, attracting a top-quality line up. The success of the meeting encouraged the Queensland ACU to apply for the running of the country's premier event – the Australian TT – for 1963.

For a few years, Lakeside was Queensland's only road racing venue, but that changed when the Surfers Paradise circuit opened in August 1966. The new circuit stole much of Lakeside's thunder, running the Queensland TT in direct opposition to the Lakeside's Queensland GP. But by the early 'seventies motorcycle racing was really booming, and Lakeside responded by hosting a string of high profile meetings that included rounds of the new multi-round Australian Road Racing Championship (which replaced the one-off Australian TT as the national title), the opening

round of the short-lived Pan Pacific International Series in 1974, and various rounds of the Swann Insurance International Series which ran from 1978 to 1988. The track also embraced the growing popularity of long distance Production Racing with several Endurance events, notably the Hub 300 which later became the Motul 300, run over 125 laps.

In 1983, Motorcycle Sportsmen, under the presidency of Geoff Howie, began a campaign to make the track safer. A chicane, known as the Bus Stop, or Dog Leg, was placed at the exit of the followed by a short narrow section leading back onto the main track near the bridge. The new section was only completed on the eve of the scheduled practice for the Hub 300, and Michael Dowson took the win on the new Yamaha RZ500. The track length for the motorcycle-only circuit was now quoted as 2.326 kilometres, and the Bus Stop added about five seconds to lap times.

In this form, Lakeside continued on through the 'eighties, running Australian Road racing Championship rounds, the annual Hub 300, and in 1987, a round of the Swann International Series, where coming man Kevin Magee scored two clear wins for the local Marlboro Yamaha team before joining the works-supported Lucky Strike Yamaha squad for the 1988 World

500cc Championship. The following year, Lakeside hosted the second of the three Swann Series rounds where young Michael Doohan, mastered the slippery conditions to take out both races. But all was far from well at Lakeside, which passed into receivership in 1999. When the site came up for auction, it was purchased by the Pine Rivers Shire Council for \$600,000, and in 2001 the Queensland State Government achieved a world-first by having Lakeside International Raceway listed as a Heritage Site. Thus began a series on legal manoeuvres, threats and challenges that eventually saw, in October 2005, another world-first – the removal of the Heritage listing!

Eventually, submissions were called for the re-opening of the track on a limited basis, and a number of bodies, including Motorcycling Australia and Motorcycling Queensland, entered into discussions. In December 2007, the operators of Queensland Raceway (Wrexmere Pty Ltd) signed a 30-year lease on Lakeside with the council to operate the facility, including both driver training and racing. Racing activity was to be limited to a noise ceiling of 95db with strict time constraints as a means of appeasing neighbours, and a cap of 20 racing events per year, and no use by V8 Supercars. One change was the name: from Lakeside International Raceway to Lakeside Park.



Springboard to stardom

In today's World Superbike world, 160 horsepower would be regarded as pretty tame. 20 years ago, 160 horsepower trying to burst out of a conventional tube frame, with virtually standard suspension and brakes, was almost a recipe for disaster. The Moriwaki Kawasaki 1000 was such a device. It took courage, as well as skill, to tame a monster like this, and young Wayne Gardner had both in abundance.

The story really began in 1978, when Kiwi upstart Graeme Crosby took the Aussie superbike scene by storm with a Kawasaki Z1000 fitted

with mods that were variously the brainchild of his sponsor and mentor, ex-racer Ross Hannan, and the flair of the fledgling Japanese Moriwaki Engineering concern. Inside the engine were larger valves, stronger springs, special camshaft, breathing through 31mm Kehin carburettors, with Krober ignition and a Kawasaki-supplied close-ratio gearbox. The crank was standard apart from spot welding on the crankpins to the flywheels to stop movement – a mod that Kawasaki itself later adopted. The clutch basket was also welded up as the standard springs were no match for the 150 horsepower being fed to it. To give the transmission a slightly easier time, the standard cush-drive arrangement in the rear hub was retained. To change the steering head angle, Z650 Kawasaki triple clamps were used, with longer rear shocks on the standard steel swinging arm.

When Crosby left for Europe, Paul Feeney took over the Moriwaki. In 1980 on December 14, the Australian Superbike scene shifted to Sandown Park for the Swann Insurance International Series and the final round of the Australian Road Raceing Championships on a day which saw Melbourne produce all of the weather elements, and Mamoru Moriwaki flew from Japan to watch his creation in action. Despite the conditions, Feeney demolished the Superbike field, but what made the biggest impression on Mamoru was the young bloke who won the keenly-contested Unlimited Production race. Wayne Gardner was aboard noted racing car engineer Peter Molloy's Honda CB1100R, and he humbled plenty of big names with a classy ride in the Australian Unlimited Road-Racing Championship. Standing in the pits, Ross Hannan recalls Mamaru Moriwaki saying, "That boy can ride".



He was right. After the race, Moriwaki made a point of meeting Gardner in the pits. "I went down (to the pits) to congratulate him on his ride and to talk to him about coming to England with me. I remember looking him in the eye and seeing a special fire there. I thought that one day this boy will be the best rider in the world."

A deal was done to take Gardner and the Moriwaki to Europe for 1981, via America for the Daytona 200. In the Superbike race, Gardner finished an excellent fourth behind Wes Cooley and Crosby on Yoshimura Suzukis and Honda's rising star Freddie Spencer.

From the sunny climes of Florida it was over the pond to a brisk and breezy Cadwell Park in Northern England for Wayne's UK debut. With its wide, flat handlebars and no fairing, the blue Moriwaki looked decidedly unrefined beside the fully-faired British bikes, and was the subject of more than a few snide remarks in the paddock. But from the moment Wayne took to the track, the snickering stopped. Starting from seventh on the grid, he sliced his way through the field to

beat Crosby, defending British Superbike champion Dave Potter, Honda's number one Ron Haslam, as well as his own team mate Roger Marshall. In the second leg, he finished a close second to Dave Potter.

By the time the series reached its conclusion at Brands hatch in October, Wayne still had a mathematical chance of taking the title, but a misfire dropped him to eleventh, allowing Kork Ballington on the square-four 500cc Kawasaki to push him back to third in the final points table. It was his British final outing on the Moriwaki, although he finished the year on a triumphant note by winning the four-race, two-round Swann Insurance International Series in Australia on the Daytona bike. He had done enough to be offered a Honda Britain contract for 1982, and the path to the World 500cc title had now been forged.

Some years later, Wayne decided to recreate the blue and yellow motorcycle that had catapulted him into the elite ranks. He began with a stock 1980 model Kawasaki Z1000 – the project taking several years to complete.

"The Moriwaki was the bike that really kick-started my career," Gardner recalls. "It had stacks of horsepower and pretty ordinary handling, but I loved it. At the end of the (1981) season, I really wanted to keep that bike, but it went back to the Moriwaki family museum in Japan, so I decided to build my own. I made it a close a possible to be an exact replica of the bike I raced in Britain, right down to the specially scalloped seat. I registered it and rode it on the road for a while. What a weapon!"

Wayne's original machine had evolved somewhat from the Crosby model, with an alloy swinging arm, Lockheed brakes and some frame gusseting. The engine had also received

a few tweaks to bring the power output up close to 160 horsepower, and this was the form that the replica took. Fitted with Dunlop Racing Intermediates, the howling Moriwaki, in Wayne's capable hands was the machine to beat on 'social runs' through the made-formotorcycle roads in the hills around his native Wollongong.

In 2003, Wayne decided that the old monster should be seen again, and loaned the bike to the National Motor Racing Museum at Bathurst, where it now resides. Standing alongside later and more svelte examples of the Superbike evolution, the Moriwaki looks lumpy, mean and menacing. One can only imagine what all that power felt like scrabbling for traction around a fog-bound Cadwell Park 25 years ago.





Dual Australian Superbike Champion MALCOLM CAMPBELL


The late 1980s were a golden age when it came to professional motorbike racing in Australia. Wayne Gardner was winning the 500cc World title, Mick Doohan and Kevin Magee were on their way and like Robbie Phyllis, Tasmania's Malcolm 'Wally' Campbell was dominating domestically.

Malcolm Campbell was a two time Australian Superbike Champion, he won the prestigious Castrol Six Hour event and the Swann International Series championship in 1983, he stood on the top step when bikes raced at Bathurst and won many other national and state championship titles.

Campbell's first race was one to forget, he fell off the bike twice on his first day of racing, but undeterred he kept at it. He spent several years involved in club racing competing in

Campbell was more than "useful"; he quickly turned into one of Australia's best riders. In the mid to late-1980s he was one of the men to beat. He'd won the Castrol and New Zealand Six Hour races, several rounds of the Australian 500cc Grand Prix championship, Australian Production championships, Endurance titles, the Swann International Series and two Superbike titles. At the same time he was also looking at opportunities overseas.

After finished ninth, 14th and 16th in the respective 1989 – 91 World Superbikes Championships – which were impressive results against the big overseas factory teams – Campbell retired in 1992.

Campbell also has memories of racing at Bathurst. He won there in 1986, five years after hitting the wall at McPhillimey

One of the biggest world sporting events to hit Australia was the debut of the 500cc World Championship and its arrival at Phillip Island in 1989. Gardner had won the 1987 title and won the very first Australian race. The other local in that race was Campbell.

Following that race, Campbell had the opportunity to ride in the 500cc World Championship. He tested with Elf Honda, Team Gallina and Cabin Racing Honda.



Graeme Crosby

Graeme Crosby (born July 4, 1955) is a former Grand Prix motorcycle road racer from New Zealand.[1] Crosby has won the Daytona 200, the Imola 200, the Suzuka 8 Hours, and the Isle of Man TT.

Crosby began his racing career in 1974 in the New Zealand racing scene. In 1976, he raced in the Australian Superbike championship. He then left for Europe to compete in Britain where he won the 1980 Isle of Man Senior TT.[2] By 1980, he had worked his way up to the 500cc road racing world championship on a Suzuki RG 500. Also in 1980, he teamed up with Wes Cooley on a Yoshimura Suzuki to win the Suzuka 8 Hours endurance race and, also won the TT Formula One World Champion for Suzuki.[3]

Crosby finished fifth in the 1981 500cc championship and successfully defended his TT Formula One title. He then joined Giacomo Agostini's Yamaha factory racing team. He began the 1982 season by winning the prestigious Daytona 200.[4] Despite injuries, Crosby still managed second overall in the championship.[1] Frustrated by the internal politics of his race team Crosby quit the Grand Prix circuit after the 1982 season.

After his retirement, Crosby returned to New Zealand and has run a number of successful motorcycle businesses. He also began auto racing, driving successfully in Touring car racing, mostly in New Zealand and Australia. Crosby was inducted into the New Zealand Sports Hall of Fame in 1995.[5] In 2007, he was inducted into the New Zealand Motorcycling Hall of Fame.

Ginger leading Ago

2nd place 1970 Ulster 500 GP 15 laps 181 k's



Ginger Molloy is one of New Zealand greatest and most well-liked race pilots of the 1960s. He was also one of Bultaco's most loyal and consistent riders of the period. Encapsulating the spirit of early-1960s' motorcycle racing, Molloy caught a lift from Huntly and a boat to the Continental circus where he earned a ride with the charismatic and very Spanish Bultaco team. The Bultaco connection can be traced back to ace tuner Frank Sheene (father of Barry) who sourced Ginger his first competitive Bultaco.

Competing at the highest level between 1963 and 1970, Ginger competed in more than 370 international events and enjoyed considerable success. In 1966, he won Bultaco's first-ever Grand Prix, the 250cc Ulster GP, run in torrential rain. What is also not widely known is that 1968 was perhaps Ginger's best year; he gained 3rd in the 125, 4th in the 350 and 5th in the 250 world titles, all on Bultacos. In 1970, he finished second to Giacomo Agostini in the 500cc world championship. Overall, Ginger Molloy clocked up 66 international victories.



'Girls ride scooters'

Champion motorbike racer Peggy Hyde recalls the late 1960's and early 1970's when women weren't even supposed to race motorbikes, let alone win.

If you're a motorcycle racing enthusiast you may remember the name Peggy Hyde.

Peggy was a competitive racer in the late sixties and early seventies, a time when only men raced motorbikes.

She was also the first woman in the world to be granted an unrestricted racing licence, but the acquisition of that licence came with a fight.

Despite good performances in her early races she was issued with a 250cc restricted licence after she revealed she was a woman.

"And this is something that would normally be done as a penalty, or for a junior..." explains Ms Hyde.

"And so I actually bypassed the Victorian committee and went to the national committee... and I got back an apology and an open licence and I had no idea at the time that this was a worldwide first".

Ms Hyde encountered all manner of discrimination during the nine years she was racing.

Newspaper articles from the time printed her bust, waist and hip measurements, and comments like "She is a natural rider, braking, cornering and handling her machine like man" were common.

Ms Hyde describes some of the journalists at the time as "quite "irritating" with their sexist questions.

"It was just because of the cultural background somehow women were supposed to be incompetent at driving and so on..."

Ms Hyde says she had a natural talent for racing and was particularly lethal through corners, likening chasing down other riders on the track to "hunting".

"For road racing in particular you don't need to have brute strength when it comes to judgement and understanding what's happening, it's silly to think that women would be less competent.."

Despite her success on the track Ms Hyde says after a time she started to question what the sport was about.

"Because it was promoting a lot of noise and fuel and after a while I started to have wider concerns about it because of the environmental issues".

"And maybe I was just getting older and more sensible".

Ms Hyde still has a motorbike licence but seldom rides these days.

1911 TRIUMPH T.T. RACER



The restoration of this extremely rare Triumph started mid 1990's with the discovery of a genuine stamped and numbered 500cc TT Racer engine. The factory shortened TT racer frame was located in England and the motorcycle was restored to original factory and Isle of Man specifications.

The 1911 Triumph sales range was 4 models – the Roadster, the Free-engine Model, the TT Roadster and the TT Racer. All were 500cc; however, the TT Racer had a shortened wheelbase and adjustable open valves. These motorcycles were 'handmade' with little of an assembly line so each motorcycle differs from another depending on which engineer was working on it on the day. Research back to the 1911 factory in Coventry is difficult, however, what we can be certain about, is that the individuals who built these motorcycles are all dead!



The racer is 'jump start' however, benefits from a period Mabon clutch which, connected to a hand operated cable, allows a free engine on stop. This Mabon clutch fitted is an exact replica of the 1907 original.



From research, we believe that this is the only 1911 Triumph TT racer in the world. There is another in a museum in England, however, the exact date of manufacture of the museum motorcycle is unsure and the engine number is not genuine TT.

3 Triumph TT Racers competed in the 1911 Isle of Man TT, all finishing between 7th and 11th position. The winner of the 1911 TT was an Indian.



Characteristics of Superbike racing motorcycles



Superbike racing motorcycles are derived from standard production models, so for a bike to be eligible, the manufacturer must first **homologate** the model and manufacture the required number of roadgoing machines. While rules vary from series to series, in general the motorcycles must maintain the same profile as their roadgoing counterparts, with the same overall appearance as seen from the front, rear and sides. In addition, the frame cannot be modified. Teams may modify some elements of the bike, including the suspensions, brakes, swingarm, and the diameter and size of the wheels.

Superbike racing motorcycles must have **four-stroke engines** of between 850 cc and 1200 cc for twins, and between 750 cc and 1000 cc for **four cylinder** machines.

The restriction to production models distinguishes Superbike racing from **MotoGP** racing, which uses prototype machines that bear little resemblance to production machines. This is somewhat similar to the distinction in car racing between **touring cars** and **Formula One** cars, though the performance gap between Superbike and MotoGP racing is much smaller.

The work's first 'Superbike' was built by brothers Ross and Ralph Hannan in the mid/late 1970s. First ridden successfully in Australia and overseas, including the Suzuka 8 hour and the Bol d'Or 23 hour endurance races, by **Graeme Crosby** who went onto International success and was eventually inducted into the NZ sports "Hall of Fame".
